Policy Document: Green Campus Initiative

Introduction:

The Green Campus Initiative at Mahatma Jyotiba Fule College of Social Work aims to create an environmentally sustainable and ecologically responsible campus community. This policy document outlines the guidelines, goals, and strategies to be implemented to achieve a green campus.

Objectives:

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Strategies and Implementation:

a. Energy Conservation:

- Promote the use of LED lighting, energy-efficient appliances, and motion sensor-based lighting systems.
- Encourage faculty, staff, and students to turn off lights and electronic devices when not in use.

- Conduct regular waste audits and monitor waste generation and disposal practices.

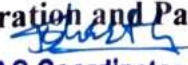
D. Green Infrastructure:
